PRINCIPAL SPEAKERS AT THE FUEHRER'S CONFERENCES

ASSMANN Kapitan z. See 1939-42, in the Operational Division of the Naval War Staff. 1942-43, executive officer on the Tirpitz. From October 1943 till the end of the war, sorved at the Fuchror's headquarters. (Trans.VII/50,VII/51,VII/55,VII/56) von BELOW Obcrst. 1940, special dutics officer with Reichsminister for Air. (Trans.VII/55,VII/56) CHRISTIAN Generalmajor. 1940, with Fliegerkorps X. 1941-43, General Staff Officer representing OKL with the Chief of the Operations Staff of OKW. Later became Chief of Air Force Operations Staff. At the end of the war, was head of Air Force Staff, North. (Trans.VII/44,VII/45,VII/49,VII/55,VII/56) DOENITZ Grossadmiral. F.O.I.C. U-boats throughout the war. In January, 1943, succeeded Raeder as C.-in-C. of the Navy. (Trans.VII/49,VII/53) Adjutant of the Army General Staff to the Fuehrer, from ENGEL Oberstleutnant. March 1938 to January 1944. (Trans.VII/44) Reichsmarschall Luftwaffe. GOERING

1940, in command of 2nd Panzer Army; this command given up in 1942 because of ill-health. 1943, Inspector-General of Tank Forces, directly responsible to the Fuehrer. July 1944, appointed Chief of Army General Staff.

Konteradmiral. 1942, appointed permanent representative of the Navy at the Fuchrer's headquarters.

July 1941, head of Keitel's operational section; responsible for the Russian plan. 1942, Deputy Chief of Operations Staff of OKW. November 1944, retired owing to ill-health.
