DOENITZ Grossadmiral. F.O.I.C. U-boats throughout the war. In January, 1943, succeeded Raeder as C.-in-C. of the Navy.

HERMANI Oberstleutnant. Deputy Chief of the Army General Staff, 1945.

HEWEL Gesandter.
