

## BRASSEY'S WORLD AIRCRAFT & SYSTEMS DIRECTORY 1998/99

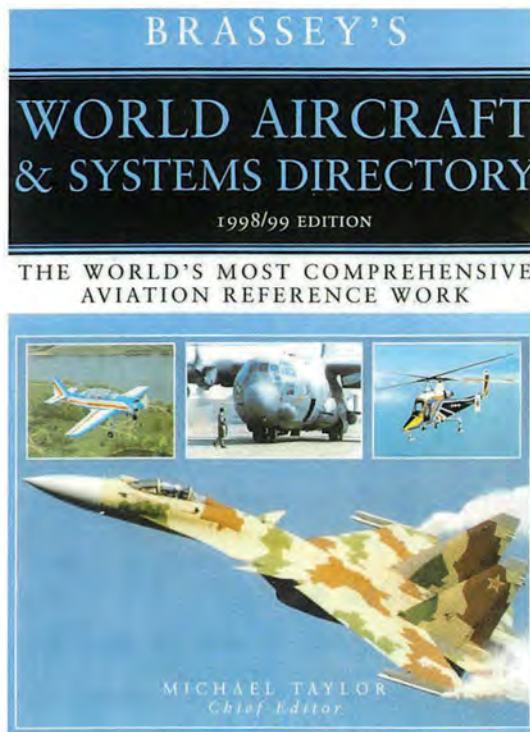

Somewhat immodestly described by its publishers as "the ultimate reference work for the aerospace industry", *Brassey's World Aircraft & Systems Directory* (WA&SD) lives up to their claims by making further refinements in its second edition.

Fully revised and updated, the publication this time boasts a second colour, larger illustrations and the addition of air-to-surface, anti-ship and anti-armour missile drawings. Another innovation, "taking into account widespread demand", is a Spaceflight section which details operational commercial launch vehicles and manned spacecraft. Other subjects covered in WA&SD include electronic warfare and special reconnaissance/surveillance types, combat aircraft, helicopters and gyros, air-launched missiles and airborne radars.

This is typical of the scope of a publication which, it is claimed, contains much material which cannot be found in any other single source reference book. PBW
