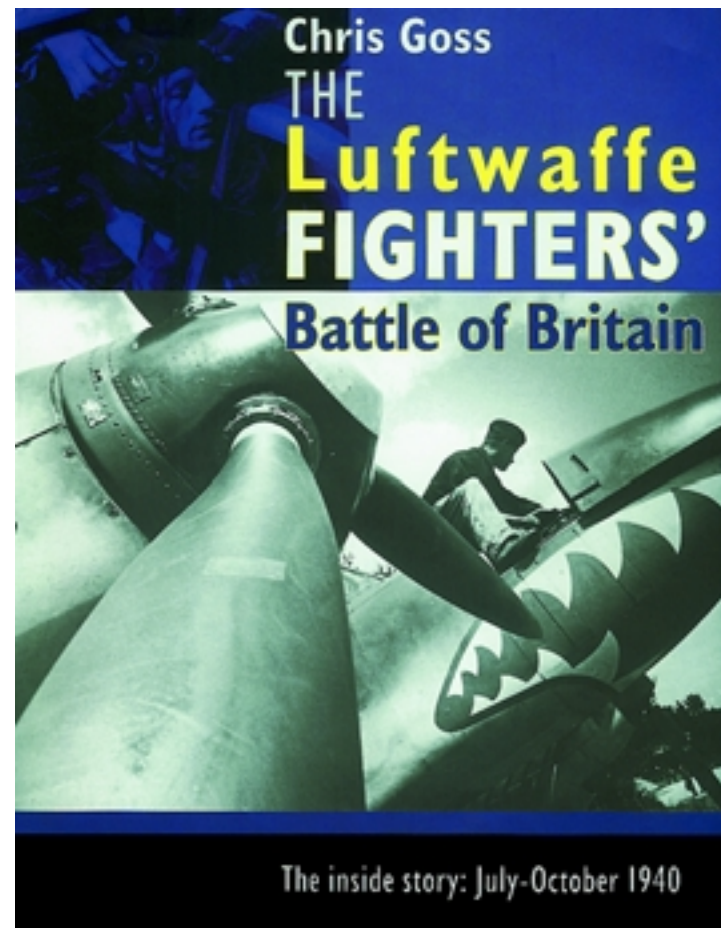


THE LUFTWAFFE FIGHTERS' BATTLE OF BRITAIN

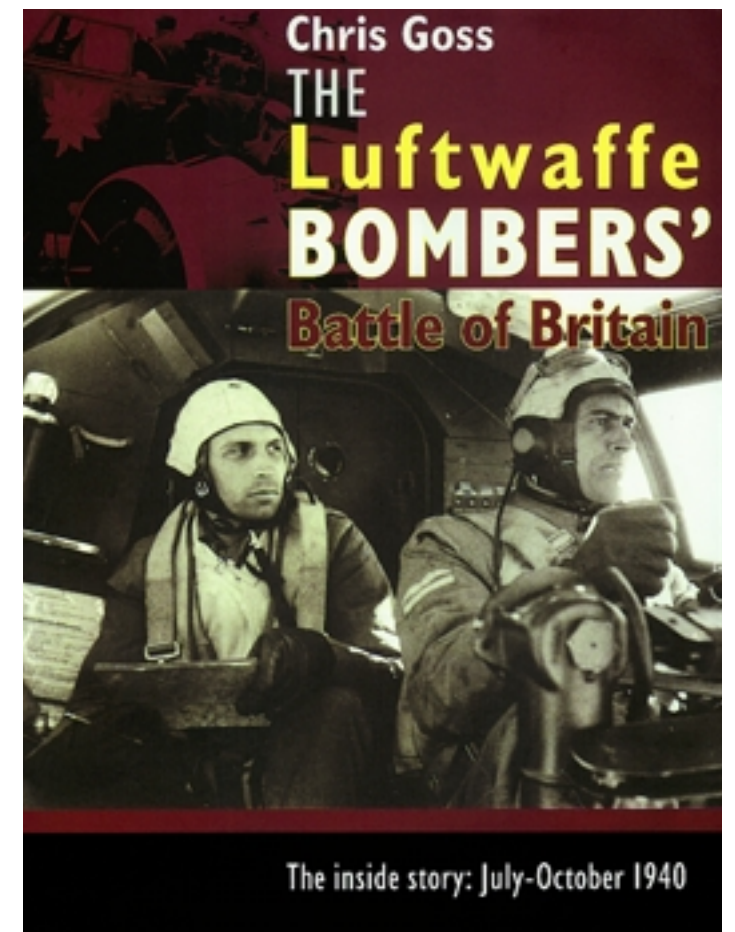
The story of how the outnumbered RAF fought and defeated the superior *Luftwaffe* in the Battle of Britain will always be a source of fascination.
